

assion fuels division. And gun guys ... well, gun owners are a very passionate lot. Glock guys nag on the "anti-Glockers," lead bullet die-hards shun the copper trends, and the list goes on. And, if I were a wagering man, I'd bet that you've occupied a chair at more than one bonfire where good friends got hotter than the flames as they argued about which cartridge is "better" for this task or that.

While I disapprove of quarreling among ourselves, I do understand the premise of taking an unwavering stand on something and defending it to the grave. Hell, I've started more than a few passionfueled, gun-related conversations myself!

Outside the eternal struggle to label the .30-06 as either the absolute best or absolute worst cartridge of all time, ARs seem next in line as the biggest "no-no" conversation at the Thanksgiving table.

It was an insatiable desire to hunt that brought guns into my life well before my 12th birthday. As for many of us, that journey started with a pellet gun, then a rimfired .22 LR and eventually, the centerfires.

I still gravitate toward the classic boltaction sporter designs, and I maintain the mindset that the dings and scratches in a wooden stock (and the memories that made them) matter more than the stamp on the barrel ever will. However, I've also fallen in love with the AR platform and its ability to be customized very, very easily.

So, if you're a hardcore "traditionalist" who has double-digit bolt guns lined up in the safe and can tear down a 1911 with Forrest Gump-like speed—and you're also considering a horizon expansion into new territory—give our cover story a look. #### Turning the AR-15 into a 'Super Thumper.'

#### **HISTORICAL NOTES**

The .450 Bushmaster's parent cartridge is the .45 Professional, a rifle/cartridge conversion developed by Tim LeGendre of LeMag Firearms LLC and licensed to Bushmaster Firearms International for production and distribution. LeGendre still retains ownership. The .450 Bushmaster is designed to be used in the standard M-16/AR-15 platform using fiveround magazines.

Bushmaster asked Hornady to produce the .45 Professional ammunition for this project, and it agreed. Hornady wanted the .45 Professional shortened to accommodate its 250-grain, pointed SST bullet. Hornady asked Bushmaster for the change (from 1.771 inches to the now-standard 1.7 inches), and Bushmaster asked LeGendre to sign off on that change, which he did. Bushmaster eventually wanted

a name change, and LeGendre also agreed to that. Thus, the popular .450 Bushmaster.

Based on a concept by Colonel Jeff "Thumper" Cooper, the goal was to provide guaranteed one-shot kills with a large-bore semi-auto (.44-caliber or larger) on big-game animals at 250 yards. Cooper, when presented with the early .45 Professional, stated, "This is Thumper Senior ... I can now own an AR-15."

A .45 Pro was, indeed, built for Colonel Cooper. This was remarkable, considering his disdain for the AR-15 in 5.56 NATO. Hornady, with its expertise, busted the Cooper 250-yard limit. The result is that the .450 Bushmaster semi-auto rifle/cartridge combination absolutely provides more than enough stopping power to adequately kill all big game in North America. Some of the companies that chamber the round in semi-autos include Radical Firearms, Bushmaster and

Windham Weaponry, and CVA chambers a couple of single-shot break-actions for the round.

#### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

While the two cartridges have nothing in common dimensionally, the appearance of the .450 Bushmaster recalls the old .401 Winchester, which was designed for another auto-loading rifle-the Winchester Model 1910. The .401 Winchester is capable of pushing along a .40-caliber, 250-grain bullet at 1,900 fps, while the .450 Bushmaster pushes along a .45-caliber bullet of the same weight at 2,200 fps. But, due to its higher velocity, as well as the more streamlined shape of the Hornady FTX bullet, the newer cartridge delivers a deadlier blow downrange. Out to about 225 yards, it retains sufficient energy to handle game as large as moose and elk. **GDTM**

## CUSTOMER DRIVEN, AMERICAN MADE (Dropping in' on

The new Impact trigger from Timney is a direct result of delivering what customers want. It's a high-quality, affordable, drop-in unit for the AR-15.

he Mosin-Nagant is a Russian-made, five-shot, boltaction rifle developed in the late 1880s. It was used by the Russian and Soviet Union armed forces until 1991, and more than 37 million have been made. At times, decommissioned military versions were sold in the United States for as little as \$50 apiece. Although ruggedly constructed and suitable for big-game hunting, these rifles are utilitarian at best.

To the shock of almost everyone, in 2010, Timney Triggers began offering a drop-in trigger for the Mosin-Nagant. Why would the world's leading trigger manufacturer offer a trigger costing as

much—or more than—the rifle it was designed for? It's simple: because that's what its customers asked for.

#### THE TIMNEY COMMITMENT

A lot of manufacturers in the firearms industry claim to be customer-responsive, but none has demonstrated that commitment like Timney. Its trigger for the Mosin-Nagant is perhaps the starkest example, but Timney's introduction of two-stage Remington 700 and AR-15 triggers, as well as the complete drop-in assembly for the Ruger 10-22, were also driven by customer demand. This dedication to delivering what customers want continues: Timney's newest trigger for the

the business philosophy of Timney Triggers.

AR-15, which is called the "Impact" and retails for only \$149.99, is a direct result of customers asking for a less-expensive, high-quality trigger for their MSRs.

How can a company afford to be so customer-responsive and still make money? It all revolves around leadership and management practices that put customers, employees and innovation at the forefront. Today's Timney Triggers thrives because of the mindset of the man that holds the reins of that company in his hands. His name is John Vehr.

#### THE MAN BEHIND THE COMMITMENT

In 1981, John Vehr's parents purchased a trigger manufacturing company from Alan Timney. At that time, Timney built triggers for bolt-action rifles such as Mausers, Springfields and Enfields; and it was also known for aftermarket triggers for bolt-action rifles.

Son John Vehr was a rock climber who

financed his bolder scaling adventures by running a landscaping business. In 1994, his parents hired him as the general manager of their trigger company, but just six years later, they both passed away.

Vehr had a vision of where he wanted to take the company. By focusing on the customer and producing the highest-quality products possible, he wanted to make Timney Triggers an all-American-made company that set the standard in aftermarket triggers. He wanted a next-generation machine shop that was well-lit and highly organized.

One of his first steps in realizing that dream was to staff Timney with the best employees he could find. The second was to invest in modern machinery.

#### **MORE THAN BOLT-GUN TRIGGERS**

It was during a 2005 Wyoming varmint hunt with several gun writers that Vehr and Timney Triggers took steps to make their first big splash. Vehr returned home to Arizona with the idea that Timney

A former rock climber and landscaper, Timney Triggers owner John Vehr has an extremely analytical, business-focused mind. (He's also a lot of fun to be around!) would start making a high-quality, dropin trigger for the AR-15.

In 2006, that trigger became a reality. Not only was it an exceptionally well-made trigger the end user could easily install, it also greatly increased Timney's





customer base and showed that the company could do more than just make triggers for bolt guns. To make sure Vehr and his company were getting that point across to the gun industry and their customers, Timney followed up the AR-15 trigger with a drop-in unit

for the Ruger 10-22.

To branch out even further, Timney introduced the first drop-in trigger for a shotgun in 2010. The "Trigger-Fix" for the Remington 870 shotgun became an instant hit with hunters and even in the tactical market. With these new

models, business at Timney was booming, allowing the company to move into a new, state-of-the-art facility in 2013. It also allowed the company to secure a larger cadre of talented employees.

#### **LIVING THE VISION**

Today, Timney Triggers is clearly the realization of John Vehr's vision. The company's 25,000-square-foot manufacturing plant looks like something you would see in a futuristic dream. The machines run 24 hours per day, and the facility is well-lit, hospitalclean and highly automated. It's also staffed with smiling faces attached to folks who are driven to deliver high-quality products to the customer.

Vehr's vision has led to many new trigger introductions, such as the "Hit," which is made for the Remington 700 and intended for precision shooters. It has a low-end pull weight setting of only 0.5 pound. It's also led to numerous partnerships with firearms manufacturers. Daniel Defense, Sig Sauer and Seekins Precision all use Timney triggers in some





of the firearms they manufacture.

Timney Triggers is unquestionably the world leader when it comes to the manufacture of aftermarket triggers. It now produces more than 170 models for bolt-actions, shotguns, ARs and other semi-automatic rifles. John Vehr will tell you that it's all because he invested in great people, along with a great facility for them to thrive in.

However, I'm convinced there's a little something more at work here.

I was visiting with Vehr at the last SHOT Show, where we were talked with another manufacturer who was complaining about his employees. Vehr, who's generally a fun-loving guy (and you always wonder if he's *ever* serious!), made a comment I think anyone in a leadership position should heed:

"If you're in charge, and you're having problems with your employees or your business, it's *your* fault. You have to be willing to admit you might be

doing something wrong and figure out what has to change. Everything is your responsibility; *you* have to fix it."

Those are words of wisdom for sure, and it's hard not to give them weight. After all, John Vehr took over a small and arguably struggling business that was filling a niche need. By educating the

customer on the importance of a good trigger and by assembling good people in a modern environment, he made that company the most recognized trigger source in the world.

What's next for Timney? That's a very easy question to answer: It's whatever its *customers* want! **GDTM**

overpriced and overrated when it was discontinued in 2005. It still is.

Additionally, at a time when affordable, concealable, lightweight handguns are the driving force in the market, did Colt really think modern gun guys would flock to a 2¾-pound, \$1,500 revolver? Or was it just praying on the emotions of baby boomers?

As for the Ruger-57, it's a totally new handgun with a 20-round capacity that weighs only 23.5 ounces. It's also chambered for a cartridge with tremendous ballistic potential and minimal recoil. Yeah, I know: There are just a few commercially offered loads for the 5.7x28mm FN, but that's changing. Federal will soon be introducing a 40-grain Gold Dot load, and you can bet that with a new, reliable, less-than-\$800 pistol—the Ruger-57—on the market, other manufacturers will soon be offering new loads too.

#### **CHANGE OF PLANS**

I had one of the first Ruger-57s and was promised ammo from the first batch of Gold Dots.

So, you might be wondering why, even though I'm so high on the Ruger-57, it's being discussed in a column instead of a feature article. Well, I was supposed to have received the new Speed Gold Dot ammunition just in time to test it



in the Ruger-57 for this *Gun Digest* issue. The problem was, with the demand on ammo, along with the myriad coronavirus concerns, the ammo now won't be available until later this summer.

The intent was to discuss everything—the pistol as a self-defense handgun; its out-of-the-box compatibility with a Vortex Venom reflex sight; and the effectiveness of this new ammo—in the same feature article. In *Gun Digest* fashion, this would've been an exclusive and practical article. But now, I guess you could say that the article was unfortunately "COVID-19'd."

#### **FOR STARTERS**

The pistol, which ships with an adjustable rear sight and a fiber-optic front, also comes with a removable section of the slide that's been pre-cut to accept the Vortex Venom reflex sight. It was easy to install and just as easy to zero. To date, all my work with this pistol has been with the Venom sight installed.

All that aside, I've had the opportunity to shoot this pistol a good bit—and you'll be hearing more from me about it soon. In the meantime, let me tell you what I like about it.

For starters, the 20-round magazine is also very easy to load; it loads like

a magazine for an AR-15. It also has a manual, ambidextrous thumb safety that's not just a safety. In 1911 fashion, it also locks the slide in battery.

It comes standard with a five-slot, under-barrel Picatinny accessory rail to allow for the attachment of a light, laser or a light-and-laser combo unit. And, although the grip is a bit deep, it's still slim and well-stippled because of the length of the 5.7x28mm cartridge, thus allowing for a good purchase.

Most importantly, the pistol has proved to be perfectly reliable and accurate. I've pushed 100 rounds of the Federal American Eagle 40-grain FMJ load and almost 100 rounds of the FN 40-grain Hornady V-Max load—also assembled by Federal—through the Ruger-57. It digested everything without a hiccup.

Now, I'm not as good at shooting a handgun with a reflex sight as I am with open sights, because I don't do it as often. However, I'm improving, and I found I could easily and repetitively put five rounds into a 5-inch circle at 5 yards in fewer than 3.5 seconds—while drawing from concealment no less! Because the pistol is so soft-shooting, I expect that with some

And—get this—hitting 6-inch steel plates from the seated position at 50 yards was easy.

#### **APPLICATIONS**

So, what's the best application for the Ruger-57? For starters, it's damned fun to shoot (and that's reason enough to buy one!). However, before I can speak with any authority on its use for personal protection, I need to see the Gold Dot ammo and its capabilities.

Admittedly, the pistol looks big, but it's really about the same size as a full-sized 1911. It weighs half as much and, for all practical purposes, it holds three times as much ammunition.

Here, in West Virginia, you can spring gobbler hunt with any kind of gun you like. I don't like shotguns, and this pistol seems as if it might be ideal for turkey birds (I'll let you know how that goes).

Where the Ruger-57 might really shine is as a home-defense pistol. Because of its red-dot compatibility and easy accessorizing with a weapon-mounted light/laser, it makes for a handgun that just about any teenaged or adult household member could effectively manage.

I'm anxious to spend some more time with this pistol but, as I patiently write this, I'm in need of ammunition—as are a lot of folks in the United States. **GDTM** 

## WHERES KET's Brass Deflector. BRASS?

ome people fuss—even obsess over AR-15 brass ejection direction and distance. I'm pretty easygoing about which way it goes and how far. Except.

Except when I have to pick it up. My gun club has a "you-shot-it-you-pick-it-up" policy. I know; I wrote the club's rule book. Literally.

So, there's your AR brass, strewn all over the range, even when you were standing in one spot. What to do?

Well, there's the military or CMP gizmo, which is a plastic deflector that clips into the carry handle of your AR.

Oh, wait! No carry handle? And no desire to simply change the direction? And the CMP device is just there to keep from tossing brass on the guy next to you.

#### KINETIC ENERGY TOOLS TO THE RESCUE

The Kinetic Energy Tools (KET) brass deflector is simplicity itself. You take one of the three plastic clips, and you attach the tongue to it. Then, slide the plastic stiffener into the tongue. Clip the assembly onto the top rail of your

AR-15. Every AR has a top rail these days, right? Then, you attach the deflector cape onto the clip.

Voilà! Your brass is dropped at your feet. You could, if you were diligent enough, even put a cardboard box at your feet right where the brass drops and have the majority of it fall into the box and save you time.

If you have a scope attached where the clip would go, use one of the two scope clips (one clip is 1 inch; the other is 30mm). The three clips are necessary simply because some people, even though they have a top rail on their receiver, have the rail so crowded with optics that the only place left is on a scope.

The tongue has a length of hookand-loop fastener on it, and you can adjust just where and at what angle the "cape" (deflector) sticks in place.

Now, someone will probably get the bright idea of "Let's stick a bag on there and save the picking up." Bad idea: The weight of the brass will hamper your aim, and you'll build bad habits of swaying and compensating for the weight.

#### **LIGHT BULB MOMENT**

The deflector is made of heavy-duty fabric—what appears to be Cordura nylon—and you can have your brass deflector in any of six colors or color combinations.

There are also two hook-and-loop panels, so you can attach a morale patch, club patch or other extra if you wish to have that look.

Because it's lightweight and heat resistant (not that I expect to subject my brass deflector to any significant heat. But it's nice to know that hot brass won't be a problem), you can use it until it gets so grubby from powder residue, dirt, grime and mud from the range that you can't stand to touch it. Remove any patches and just slosh it around in some soapy water, rinse, and leave it in the sun to dry—but don't leave it where some light-fingered member of your gun club might see it.

When you're done shooting, pop it off your rifle, fold or wad it up, and stuff it back into your range bag for the next time. The whole combo takes up less space—*a lot* less—than a 20-round AR-15 magazine.





Just when I'd thought that reloading had become a specialty pastime that was relegated to the precision shooters and to the dangerous-game hunters looking to make their ammunition more affordable, this "little episode" comes along, putting shooters into a panic and turning eyes toward reloading again in order to feed the common guns.

global pandemic caused the public to

grab nearly anything and everything

they could get their hands on.

While I'm in no way pleased about the coronavirus, I'm always happy to see more hunters and shooters become interested in reloading. So, for those considering taking the steps to learn how to reload, here's a look at the simplest set of tools you need to get started:

- >> Reloading press
- >> Scale
- >> Reloading dies
- >> Hand primer
- >> Correlative shellholder
- >> Brass case trimmers

- >> Chamfer and deburring tool
- >> Caliper
- >> Rotary tumbler
- >> Lubricant
- >> Powder funnel
- » Reloading manual
- >> Notebook
- >> Loading block
- **>>** Components

A **reloading press** is the nucleus of the operation. It'll perform several operations: resizing brass cases, flaring case mouths, and seating and crimping projectiles in the case. I like a simple, single-stage press such as the RCBS RockChucker IV, Lyman Brass Smith Victory press and the Redding Big Boss press. The O-frame press is strong, reliable and, if properly cared for, it'll give a lifetime of use.

Reloading dies are what you'll use to re-form a spent case back to the specifications required to make it chamber and fire properly. They're cartridge-specific and usually come in sets of two or three. A straight-walled cartridge will require

a third die—in order to flare the case mouth—and a bottleneck cartridge will require only two dies.

In addition, a resizing die to return the fired case to its original size and a seating die to install the new projectile are required. Reloading dies are interchangeable, so RCBS dies, for example, will work in a Redding press ... unless the dies are the larger, 1-inch die bodies that big safari cartridges require. A correlative shellholder for your particular cartridge will be needed in conjunction with the reloading dies.

**A scale** is necessary to properly measure the powder charges you'll install in the resized and re-primed cases. The simplest, and most reliable, is the balance-beam scale. I like the Redding Model No. 2 and RCBS M500 for their reliability, simplicity and durability. I've spent time with both and find each of them to be valuable.

If your reloading press doesn't have a priming arm (most do; some don't), you'll need a **hand primer** to install a new primer in your cases. I'm a fan of the RCBS Universal Hand Priming Tool and the Lyman E-ZEE Prime Universal Hand Priming Tool. They handle both large and small primers and are an efficient means of seating primers in your cases.

You'll need a means of trimming your brass cases, and there are all sorts of tools available, from electric motor-driven models to hand-cranked models. The hand-operated models are more affordable, yet they still deliver the goods. The Redding Model 2400 Precision Trimmer is a great means of keeping your cases trimmed to a proper length. Trimming your cases is important for rifle cases, but it's imperative for pistol cases: The 9mm, .40 S&W and .45 ACP need a good, square case mouth for headspacing, and the revolver cases need a consistent case length for proper crimping.

Once trimmed, you'll need to dress the case mouth, and the L.E. Wilson chamfer and deburring tool is an affordable and effective means of handling that chore.

Absolutely necessary is a means of measuring things—case length, overall cartridge length, bullet diameters, etc. A good caliper, whether digital or dial, will quickly become a good friend.

You'll need to polish your cases so they feed easily and also to avoid introducing dirt and grime into your chamber. A **rotary tumbler** in the easiest means of polishing the cases. The RCBS Rotary Case Tumbler gets the job done quickly and easily via an abrasive medium that removes the tarnish. Trust me, clean cases will make life much easier in both your reloading dies and in your firearms.

A form of **lubricant** is also required so the brass cases don't stick in your reloading dies. I've become a fan of Imperial Sizing Die Wax. It lasts a long time, and a little goes a long way. For pistol cases, if you choose a carbide sizing die, you won't need lubricant.

You'll also need a **powder funnel**, which is a specialized tool for neatly putting powder into your cases. They're The powder funnel makes sure the The Hornady powder charge goes into the case, Lock-N-Load where it belongs-not all over the single-stage bench and floor. press is perfect for the beginner.

cheap and plentiful, so grab a spare.

A **reloading manual** is an excellent resource. It's more than just a list of "recipes." Most also include cartridge histories, reloading processes and other highly valuable information. I've accumulated a collection of reloading manuals over the years, and I've actually contributed to a couple as well.

Another good idea is a **notebook** for you to keep detailed records of your loads. You'll find yourself reaching back for your notes more than you think.

A **loading block**, which is designed to hold cases of a specific diameter while loading, is a good idea. There are plastic models available, along with moreexpensive machined aluminum blocks. Alternatively, you can make your own from a block of wood and a drill bit. They certainly help keep things organized.

Quite obviously, you'll need a supply of

**components**, including the proper size and type of primer, projectiles of suitable size and weight for the cartridge you're loading and a supply of powder for that cartridge. All of these will be outlined in your reloading manual.

There are hundreds of specialized tools available for the reloader, but for those of you just getting started, this list will suffice while you learn. If you prefer, there are kits available that provide most, if not all, of the tools highlighted above. Redding, RCBS, Hornady, Lyman and Lee all offer a beginner's reloading kit, so there's something for all budgets.

Just one word of advice: When you find the combination of components your guns like, keep enough supplies on hand to make a sufficient supply of ammunition. GDTM

# Chassis systems, scopes with variable power, bullets with higher velocities and better BCs—things are changing quickly.

verything in precision rifles is changing so quickly that it's often hard to keep up. I frequently tell my students that precision rifles from the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century to just after 9/11 moved at a snail's pace. Lumbering in from the cold, carrying a varmint-style hunting rifle, tactical bolt-action was happy to do the same thing it did the year before, with little reason to adjust. After 9/11, money started to flow around the military use of sniping and, not far behind that, competitions ramped up tenfold.

The current USMC variant has a 20-inch barrel and uses

a Surefire suppressor.

If we follow the Marine Corps from sniping in Vietnam to today, we have a comprehensive record of changes. We can follow the M40 from the first generation to the current M40A6. Luckily for us, when it comes to upgrading its platform, the USMC moves very slowly.

#### **USMC PLATFORMS**

Many like to talk about the hunting rifles used in Vietnam, such as the Winchester

Model 70. Sure, the USMC looked at it, but it was never put in the field the way people thought it had been. In reality, its contribution was minor.

The old manuals from the 1970s have the shooter in more of a counter-sniper role. These manuals discussed the hunting rifles with heavier varmint contours and 3-9x hunting scopes. The M40 was based on the Remington 700 action with a wood hunting-style (standing-style) stock and chambered in .308 Win.

In the Late 1970s, the Marine Corps actively looked to produce a sniper rifle. A team started looking at all aspects of the rifle. The Unertl scope was spec'd out to offer a mil-spec reticle and quicker adjustments, as opposed to the capped turrets of most scopes of that era. The stock was changed from wood to fiberglass to avoid swelling: Sea water and wood make for a bad combination for consistency.

The M40A1 was not a Remington rifle. The USMC built it using many aftermarket components. It was purpose built with a McMillan HTG fiberglass stock featuring a smear-patterned camouflage. It had Winchester bottom metal off the Remington action, and the heavy, varmint-style barrel was aftermarket. Even the scope

mounts were welded in place to keep everything tight.

Many years after the M40A1, minor incremental changes were made to the system. Barrels were shorter, and suppressors were added, as were night-vision attachments. The biggest change midstream was the scope. After almost 40 years of service, the 10x Unertl was replaced with a variable-power 3-12x S&B PMII. That contract was changed slightly to include the Premier Reticle Heritage when the two companies had a major falling-out.

The M40A6 brings us to modern times. Clearly, the current rifle is nothing like the hunter rifle used during Vietnam. It went from "Terminator" to "Transformer." You can follow this evolution by noting the changes for each new upgrade—M40, M40A1, M40A3, M40A5 and M40A6.

#### **CURRENT PLATFORMS**

Initially (and this is something even found in the manuals), military snipers were selected based on their hunting background. Were you someone used to putting food on the table? When Captain Land used Gunny Hathcock to highlight sniping successes, that type of thinking was changed to include competition shooters. Hunters were considered a good

fit from a fieldcraft standpoint, but often, they were a terrible example for accuracy.

But competitions focus on consistent and precise shot placement—accuracy above all else.

#### **STOCKS AND CHASSIS**

Stocks have moved from a fiberglass/hunting style to adjustable-chassis systems. Fiberglass replaced wood, and aluminum has replaced fiberglass. So, you can now adjust the chassis to fit the shooter more efficiently. If you look at photos with guys shooting M24s or M40s, you see a lot of duct tape that's been applied to help fit the stock. But consider a shooting job for which members of the team come and go. You want a stock that can easily be adjusted.

Modern chassis-built rifles can be adapted to fit just about any scenario, even to the point of adding weights in order to dampen recoil and keep the rifle on target. Other than that, the weight compound has not changed much.

However, the systems certainly have.

Chassis don't require bedding, because they're designed to drop in, as opposed to needing to match a stock to the barrel action being used. Back in my day, you weren't allowed to remove anything from the action except the bolt. Sure, you could check torque settings, but you were told to never remove that barreled action.

When was the last time you checked a chassis to see if the barrel was touching underneath (probably never)? We used to run dollar bills under the barrels, routinely checking for debris or contact. This doesn't happen much anymore.

#### **ACTIONS AND CALIBERS**

The USMC didn't change the action, but new actions are all the rage right now. You can get a two-lug action that's a Remington clone or a three-lug, for example. My AI has a six-lug. The bolt throws from 90 degrees even 60 degrees to speed you through the process of running the bolt.

More important than the action are the new, multi-caliber rifles that have hit the streets. Although I'm an Accuracy International guy, you should check out the new Army rifle from Barrett. The MRAD is also a switch-caliber weapon system. (If I were able to tell my grandfather that my one rifle can go from .308 to .300WM to .338LM and all rounds in between, his jaw would hit the ground!) Switching calibers in one platform is the future, and the future is now. These rifles work, and they work reliably.

#### **CHAMBERINGS**

Recently, I read a thread on Sniper's Hide about guys on YouTube slamming the 6.5 Creedmoor as some crazy, out-of-touch caliber. They were comparing it to the .308—with all sort of insane claims. The problem here is one of the number of

views: The more views a video gets, the more people put faith in the message. People might consider the popularity of the message as a validation.

As far as I'm concerned, those guys are out of touch: The 6.5 CM is awesome. There's no downside to it, which is why the military is using it. The military has been using 6.5 variants for a long time, especially overseas, but even the U.S. military has been actively shooting it since at least 2015.

#### **EMBRACE THE CHANGES**

My point? Don't fear change. Adapting to modern times isn't always bad, and I strive to use these changes to fit the rifle to the shooter.

No longer do you have to wrap the shooter around the rifle; today, the rifle setup is brought to *you*. Think about the changes to the seat and steering wheel of your car. Those changes are designed to fit drivers better. It's the same idea regarding chassis systems, scopes with variable power, bullets with higher velocities and better BCs. All are designed to make you more effective in the field. **GDTM**

To start, the 16-inch-barreled, blow-back Bantam has several features you'd expect on a more expensive AR-style PC, including a lightweight, 13-inch M-Lok, aluminum, free-floated handguard and last-round hold-open. In addition, it boasts foraged receivers with a tensioning screw to ensure the tightest possible mate-up between upper and lower. Finally, it's Glock magazine compatible.

#### **03 Odin Works NAV 22** Suppressor

With its first foray into .22 LR suppressors, Odin Works delivers the NAV 22. Tubeless and configurable, the stainless steel and aircraft-grade aluminum can isn't only a snap to swab out, it's also configurable to any circumstance. If you need to dampen your rimfire to next to nothing, run all six baffles. If nimbleness is a priority, go minimal with just one. With a dB rating of 113 on a rifle weighing 4 ounces at maximum size and compatible with .22 LR, .22 WMR, .17 HMR and .17 Hornet, the NAV 22 has a huge impact for such a compact device. It's a must-have for anyone who shucks mountains of rimfire.

#### **04 MTM Case- Gard Tactical Rifle Case**

Every gun deserves a solid case. MTM Case-Gard provides them one with the introduction of its Tactical Rifle Case. Built and configured like a high-dollar hard case, this molded-plastic carrier is surprisingly light on the pocketbook. The 42-inch-long case boasts rugged snap latches, interior foam padding and multiple tiedown points and keeps your firearms as secure as if they were at home in the safe. Furthermore, if you invest in a couple, they're stackable, so storing them at home or in your trunk isn't a hassle.

#### 05 Sig .300 BLK Subsonic Hunting

The new Sig 205-grain subsonic .300 BLK load is specifically designed for use out of abbreviated barrels favored by those who shoot suppressed. At the same tick, they're topped with a unique bullet that's reminiscent of Wilhelm Brenneke's mini-wadcutter design. However, the stepped side isn't meant to provide a cutting edge—like Brenneke's bullet—but it ensures smooth feeding through a fully loaded, 30-round magazine. The Sig 205-grain subsonic 300 BLK has the stuff to stay quiet, moving at 1,000 fps at the muzzle out of a 16-inchbarreled rifle. It's jacketed lead-core projectile is engineered to reach full expansion at these mild velocities.

#### **06 Brownells BRN-180**Lower

Achieving nothing less than a masterstroke, Brownells dusted off one of Eugene Stoner's most underappreciated designs last year: the AR-180 (or, the "BRN-180"). Now, the company has the components so you can build your own piston-driven "cousin" of the AR-15. Paying homage to the original design, Brownells' lower receiver has the correct lines. However, it's been upgraded to meet modern shooters' needs. Some of these upgrades include a rear Picatinny rail to attach a stock or brace; compatibility with mil-spec parts kits; and the ability to accept USGI STANAG-style magazines. It's fantastic that Brownells has resurrected the "Widowmaker"; even better-you can now build your own.

#### **07 Fightlite**Industries Wood Stock SCR Carbine

It's never easy to get geeked-up over what's essentially a compromise AR. Nevertheless, there's something intriguing about the Fightlite Industries Wood Stock SCR Carbine (perhaps it's the walnut!). Essentially an AR, this gun has none of the cosmetic features that legislators find so objectionable ... meaning that it's legal, coast to coast. Also, because it's mil-spec, the SCR is completely upgradeable. Therefore, you can customize it beyond its hardwood stock. It's currently only available in .223 Rem./5.56 NATO. Perhaps Fightlite will offer it in .350 Legend sometime in the future.

ave you ever seen a NASCAR driver roll up his sleeves and dive, elbow-deep, under the hood of his machine? Yeah, me neither. Now, I'm confident that every driver has an intricate understanding of what goes on under all those logos while he's chewing up asphalt at 200 mph, but when parts need swapping and tweaks need tweaking, there's a guy on the team for that. The driver drives, and the mechanics wrench.

For the most part, gun owners work like this too. The majority of riflemen I know—and I'm referring to people who have multiple gun safes to house all their firearms—do little more to their firearms than pull the bolt to clean the gun. The thought of checking the torque on the action's screws or pulling the trigger assembly for a clean-and-lube darned near paralyzes them. In their minds, they do the "driving," and a qualified gunsmith does the "wrenching."

Now, don't misunderstand me one

bit here: If you're uncomfortable with opening that hood, don't do it. Tinkering with a firearm is always best left to the trained hand.

#### A DIFFERENT 'RACE CAR'

But, with that said, the AR is a completely different type of "race car"—the type that can make even the newest of shooters (or those hardcore shooters who are completely new to the platform)—look like a master mechanic. While I don't agree with those who refer to the platform as "Legos for gun guys," the modularity advantage of this statement certainly stands up. And, as a result, it's possible to change up the body and the handling of the rig without messing around with the "drivetrain."

Here's my point: Customizing something to fit your needs and personality is, simply put, fun ... whether we're talking about outfitting a truck or tweaking a firearm. I know a lot of hardcore gun guys—people who own a dozen bolt-action rifles, a half-dozen revolvers, a bunch of 1911s and even a few poly guns—who avoid the AR platform entirely, simply because it's so different from what they know.

And none of them is wrong: The AR is quite radical by old-school standards. But, in this case, radical equals intuitive, and intuitive equals easy customization.

To prove my point in an effort to inspire you to find that special "this one is mine" Zen, I detailed a part-by-part breakdown of my most recent AR project. And, to further prove my point about this being so simple that even an AR amateur can do it, I timed a good friend (who owns a bunch of rifles and pistols but has only shot one 20-round mag through an AR) during each phase. He knows guns, but he's new to ARs.

For the install of each piece, I silently observed while the included instructions were referenced. YouTube was consulted for additional instruction, as needed.

For this article, I'm not going to crawl down the torque-spec rabbit hole. You don't have to be the head cashier at Bass Pro to know that managed torque is *extremely important* in every firearm, regardless of platform. For torque specs, hit up the instructions or the website of the manufacturer that made your specific part(s).

All right; enough of that. Let's get on with it.



Model: RRAge AR-15 in 5.56 NATO

When ARs first entered the consumer market, groundlevel guns were quickly replaced by the manufacturers with, "Let's see what unique features we can slap on this gun to make our black gun different from the rest." With that came a substantial jump in pricing, and that movement essentially created a forest of niche-based ARs with price tags that alienated many potential new-toplatform shooters.

Today, "budget-friendly" is a market phrase that's reinfiltrated the lineups from most manufacturers. Finding a sub-\$500 AR is very possible: There are some diamonds in the rough, but a cheap car isn't really "cheap" if you have to replace the transmission within a few thousand miles. Get me?

I chose the Rock River RRAge as the chassis for this build, largely due to the company's outstanding reputation. As with others in this class (for example, Sig Sauer's Tread or Springfield's Saint), the reliability comes stamped with a company name that's proven its competence. The RRAge's furniture wares are as expected from a budget-friendly rifle: an M4-style stock, six-position receiver extension, very basic, A2-style pistol grip and an ejection port cover. A 16-inch barrel with a carbinelength gas system and an RRA single-stage, mil-spec trigger are also included. Absent are a forward assist and a case deflector, but I honestly couldn't care less (apologies in advance to any traditionalists out there).

#### **Carrier Group**

Make: Velocity Triggers Model: Recoil-less Bolt Carrier

MSRP: \$299.95 Time: 12 minutes

Notes: Synchronized removal of the bolt carrier group and the charging handle can be a delicate dance. It's easy, but it's gotta be just right. The same goes for the re-install of each.

I consider the upgrade to Velocity's Recoil-less Bolt Carrier group the biggest novelty buy of this build ... but it was so damned easy! Although the low-mass bolt carrier can be purchased separately, this beauty (yes, the nano-diamond nickel coating visually matches my comp and trigger quite well) performs best with the fine-tuning capabilities offered with an adjustable gas block.

In case it isn't clear, the entire premise behind the low-mass, Recoil-less bolt carrier is designed to do exactly as its name indicates: minimize recoil. Sure, the 5.56 NATO doesn't produce much to begin with, but with recoil reduction comes a reduction in muzzle rise-which means faster follow-up shots, one after another.

#### 03 The Trigger

Make: Rise Armament

Model: RA-434 High-Performance Trigger

**MSRP:** \$169 Time: 14 minutes

**Notes:** Two pins remove the two-piece mil-spec trigger. Two pins secure the one-piece drop-in.

If you retain a single sentence from this entire article, let it be this one: Replace your mil-spec trigger immediately. Take money out of your child's college fund to pay for its replacement if you have to, but get it done! It is, without question, the most impactful piece of the AR-replacement-part equation ... and, it's not that expensive. While brand options are many, I elected to go with Rise Armament's RA-434 because it operates in a sweet spot between speed (not a priority concern for my shooting disciplines) and smoothness (which should be everyone's priority) from a single-stage function.

Remember what your grandfather told you? "The gun should surprise you when it goes off." Um, no. I want a trigger that breaks cleanly and consistently so I know exactly when it's going to release during each and every shot cycle. I got that—at a 3.5-pound break—with the Rise 434. Plus, it comes packaged with anti-walk pins. And, in the name of true vanity, the trigger's silver color closely matches the bolt carrier and the comp. (Hey, looks matter!)



#### **04 The Stock**

Make: Hogue Grips

Model: Rubber Overmolded Collapsible Buttstock

MSRP: \$69.95

Time: Under 1 minute

**Notes:** It'll take you longer to open the new stock's packaging than it will for you to make the swap!

Pop the pin, slide the old stock off the rear of the tube. Push the pin on the new stock and slide it on. Don't even waste your time YouTube-ing this step ... you'll have it done before you find a suitable instructional video.

I chose the Hogue because it markets its stock as being a "beard-safe design," and anyone that creative and honest can have my money. However, more important than that was the rubber overmolding for a hard and comfortable cheekweld. There's a bit of a recoil pad, but it's semi-unnecessary with the light tickle of 5.56 NATO fire.

It's also worth noting here that not all buffer tubes are created equal (yes, I learned the hard way during my first stock swap a few years back); thus, your stock must fit accordingly. In the sometimes convoluted world of the AR, there's a "commercial tube" and a "mil-spec" tube. My RRAge has the commercial variant. Simply: The commercial buffer tube has a slightly larger diameter—about 3/100 inch. Whatever genius thought we needed two buffer tube sizes should be kicked. Hard.




#### **Arm Yourself**

Although swapping and upgrading AR parts is a fairly simple venture, it does require a few specialized tools that'll turn a simple task into an absolute piece of cake. It's a bit expensive, but Real Avid's AR15 Master Armorer's kit is ideal for the "kitchen table gunsmith" who wants every specialized tool—in one compact case—that'll be needed for the tasks at hand.

I'm sure it's obvious that I'm a fan of Velocity by the number of aftermarket parts on this build. Although I used a Rise Armament trigger here, most of my other ARs sport a Velocity trigger in the nether regions of the lower.

My favorite? Velocity's MPC (Machined Precision Trigger). Why? Massive customization. It's still a single-stage, drop-in design, but the interchangeable shoe design comes in a pile of colors and three personality-matching configurations: curved, straight, and straight with a finger stop. Trigger pull weights are available in either a 3-

or a 4-pound pull, along with trigger shoe texture options of "smooth with radius" or "serrated flat face."




Unless you're trying to do something with the rifle that you really shouldn't be doing anyway, a flash hider does little more than protect the threads (and they make thread caps for that).


#### THE SUM OF ALL PARTS

A handful of years ago, there was a movement within the shooting industry to try to relabel the AR as an "MSR" (an acronym for "modern sporting rifle"). The motives were a pure attempt to distance the platform from the "dark shadow" cast by the mainstream media's interpretation of the tool. The efforts never really took root, and I'm good with that. After all, a rose by any other name is still a rose.

Regardless of its moniker, the AR-15 is, and always has been, "America's rifle." And, with a little creativity and about an hour's worth of very enjoyable work, this one is mine. **GDTM** 









#### THE CONFUSION

Ruger's new PC Charger is, by definition, a pistol. The "PC" stands for "pistol caliber," which is a bit confusing: There's really no such thing as "pistol caliber." "Caliber" refers to the diameter of a bullet; what PC should stand for is "pistol cartridge." But then, why would a pistol be referenced as being "pistol caliber" or "pistol cartridge?"

Well, this comes from rifles that fire pistol cartridges, which are often referred to as "pistol-caliber carbines." Ruger offers the PC Carbine, a rifle that fires cartridges commonly chambered in pistols. "Charger" is the term Ruger uses to describe its pistols that are based on rifles; Ruger's 22 Charger is based on the Ruger 10/22.

If you're not confused yet, keep reading.

With these pistols—hybrid pistols, if you will—there's some confusion about how you can actually—legally shoot them, particularly if they're equipped with an arm brace. An arm brace is an extension to the rear of a pistol that resembles a buttstock. In actuality, it's there for the purpose of strapping a pistol—a pistol that's really too damned big to be shot with one hand anyway—to your arm.

Of course, once attached, it can serve as a makeshift buttstock if you'd like to shoulder the weapon. But does that then make the pistol a short-barreled rifle (SBR)? If so, it then becomes an NFA (National Firearms Act) firearm, which is highly taxed and regulated.

Initially, in 2014, it was OK to put an arm brace on a pistol and shoot it from any position you liked. But, in 2015, the ATF ruled that firing a pistol with an arm brace from your shoulder effectively made the pistol an SBR, required the filing of ATF form 1 ... along with the payment of the requisite tax. This, of course, was asinine; how you decide to *hold* a weapon should have no impact on its classification or the taxes you pay.

Huh?

But that wasn't the end of it.

In 2019, the ATF revised its position as follows: "To the extent the January 2015 Open Letter implied or has been construed to hold that incidental, sporadic, or situational 'use' of an arm-brace (in its original approved configuration) equipped firearm from a firing position at or near the shoulder was sufficient to constitute a 'redesign,' such interpretations are incorrect and not consistent with ATF's interpretation of the statute or the manner in which it has historically been enforced."

What does that mean? Well, it would appear that you *can* shoot an arm

brace-equipped pistol from any position you choose, but if you shoot it "from a firing position at or near the shoulder," it can only be done "incidentally, sporadically, or situationally." This appears to mean you can only do it at irregular intervals or only in limited situations.

Are you still confused? I am. Because of this "ruling," the conventional wisdom seems to be that you can do it sometimes, but you shouldn't show it off. (I guess it's OK to act within the law, as long as you don't brag about it.)

I know this is a nuisance of minutiae to digest just so you can shoot

your pistol. However, it's extremely important that, as legal gun owners, we don't break the law—no matter how confusing the law might be. All of this muddlement about how you can legally shoot a pistol with an arm brace got me to wondering about something that's more important from a *practical* standpoint. And that's what's best or the most effective way to shoot one of these guns.

#### **TEN TESTS, TEN RESULTS**

I figured I'd find out for myself. I took Ruger's new PC Charger and fired a string of 10 shots as fast as I thought I could make good hits on a common B27 target at 10 yards from 10 different positions. I timed and scored the results to facilitate a comparison; hits in the X, 10 and 9 rings counted for 10 points; everything else was listed at 0 points. The total of all hits was then divided by the total time, as you would with Comstock, Virginia-count scoring (that is, the larger the final score, the better). The results surprised me, and I suspect they'll surprise you as well.

I thought the best way to illustrate the information was with a brief discussion of each test/technique.

#### **Baseline Test**

#### Common pistol, two-hand stance (open sights)

First, I wanted to establish how shooting an arm-braced pistol from various positions compared with shooting a common pistol using a two-hand stance. To do this, I fired 10 shots from 10 yards with my Wilson Combat EDC X9 using a two-hand stance and open sights. I scored 90 points, and it took 4.91 seconds for a final score of 18.33.

#### Technique 1

#### PC Charger, one-hand stance (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

I didn't expect a lot from this test. After all, trying to fire a 6.5-pound handgun with one hand shouldn't produce great results. Accuracy-wise, however, with six 10-zone and four 9-zone hits for 100 points, I didn't do too badly. But it took 10.8 seconds to get those hits for a score of 9.26. This is a stupid way to shoot this pistol unless you're trying to show off or it's the only option you have, given the circumstance. It makes the *idea* of an arm brace seem magical.

#### Technique 2

#### PC Charger, two-hand stance (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

In this test, the PC Charger was fired with two hands on the pistol grip. I logged 100 points, but it took 11.1 seconds for a score of 9.01, making this method about half as effective as shooting a common handgun in the same manner. The recoil of a 9mm Luger in a 6.5-pound gun is nominal but, given the heavy gun, it was slow to get back on target for follow-up shots.



#### Technique 3

#### PC Charger, two-hands, carbinestyle (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

This was similar to Test 1, except that I held the PC Charger at the pistol grip with my shooting hand and on the forearm-behind the handstop—with my support hand, as you might fire a sawed-off shotgun. The point count was 100, and the time was 9.02 seconds. Everything that applies in Test 2 applies here, with the additional note that the hand-stop on the forearm of the PC Charger was very uncomfortable during recoil. That said, it's a damned good idea it's there, because it keeps your support hand from inadvertently moving forward in front of the muzzle.

#### Technique 4

#### PC Charger, one-hand with arm brace (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

I was excited to try out the "magical" arm brace that's caused all the confusion. I secured the very well-made and folding Sig Sauer PCB Kit for its MPX/MCX to the PC Charger. It attached to the Picatinny end rail with a single screw. Holding the pistol with one hand and with the arm brace strapped on the shooting arm, I again managed 100 points-but it took 11.43 seconds for a final score of 8.75. It was the slowest of any method tested. This was uncomfortable, slow and unwieldy. Sure, I'd suggest you try it, if for no other reason than that you could then agree with me that it's ridiculous.

#### Technique 5

#### PC Charger, hip-shooting (no aiming device)

Mostly for entertainment purposes, this test involved shooting the PC Charger from the hip without the aid of an aiming device. This was my "Hollywood" test, and with it, I only scored 40 points. However, all 10 shots were fired in only 3.96 seconds for a final score of 10.10. Just as a side note: One shot missed the entire target. With practice, you might get a bit better at this technique, but it's doubtful you'll ever be good enough to trust it to save your life or to not shoot things you don't intend to shoot.


#### Technique 6

PC Charger, hip-shooting (laser)
I then installed a Surefire X400 lightand-laser combo and fired another
10 shots from the hip while aiming
with the laser. This is where the PC
Charger began to shine and perform
better than a common pistol. I scored
100 points in 5.33 seconds for a final
score of 18.76. This might be the
best way to utilize the PC Charger.
It's fast, keeps the gun close to
your body for retention purposes, is
comfortable and would work well in
close quarters. Lasers work!




A two-hand, carbine-like stance with the Ruger PC Charger is a bit uncomfortable and proved to be

#### **CONCLUSIONS**

Let's qualify all this testing with the admission that—with practice—you or I should be able to improve our performance with the PC Charger or similar pistol with all the techniques tried. I shoot a common handgun a lot, and my room for improvement there is limited. However, with the exception of

firing the gun from the shoulder, as you would a common carbine, I've limited experience with the other methods tried. Several range sessions and 1,000 rounds of ammo should show marked improvement with one or more of these techniques.

I found lots of merit in using the strap as resistance while pushing the

PC Charger forward with a carbine-like hold using both hands. Given the logic in a weapon such as this having a strap, this might be the best technique to focus on during training. Likewise, shooting from the hip and chest while using a laser to aim showed great promise.

As for the other techniques, I'd rate them as better than being unarmed but

## Technique 7

### PC Charger, strap-resistance (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

One of the most common methods for shooting a pistol of similar design to the PC Charger is to use a strap and force the pistol out in front of your body while holding it at the grip and forearm, using the strap as resistance. Doing so while using the Crimson Trace reflex sight, I managed 100 points in 7.62 seconds for a final score of 13.12. Not bad ... but not nearly as effective as a common pistol with a two-hand stance. Of course, practice will undoubtedly improve performance, and a strap is a good idea on a gun that weighs almost 7 pounds.

## Technique 8

## PC Charger, shoulder (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

Having shot the PC Charger employing several methods, I figured it was now "incidentally, sporadically, or [and] situationally" legal to shoot it by placing the arm brace against my shoulder. I did so using the Crimson Trace reflex sight and logged 100 points in 5.58 seconds for a score of 17.92. This was the third best score the PC Charge managed, and it was very much like shooting an AR-15—but one with an uncomfortable and low cheek weld, which probably explains the slower-than-you-would-expect engagement time.

## Technique 9

### PC Charger, arm brace to cheek (Crimson Trace CTS 1400 reflex sight)

In an effort to avoid violating the 2015 ATF ruling, some shooters began placing the butt of the arm brace against their cheek or chin when shooting these hybrid-type pistols. I tried this and found it uncomfortable. Nevertheless, I did achieve 100 points in 7.45 seconds for a score of 13.42. Here's the thing: If I were using one of these hybrid pistols to defend my life, I'd just forget this technique and put the damned thing against my shoulder. I'd worry about potential ATF violations—if I managed to survive the gunfight.

## Technique 10

## PC Charger, arm brace to chest (laser)

The final test—and this was mostly conducted for the purpose of giving me 10 tests to evaluate—was shooting the PC Charger with the arm brace resting on the center of my chest while using the Surefire X400 laser to aim. In 3.66 seconds, I poked six holes in the 10-ring, three in the 9-ring and one in the 8-ring for a total of 90 points and a score of 24.59. It was, without question, the fastest and most effective method of shooting the PC Charger. Unless you have a very short neck or oddly shaped chest, it'll place an optical sight too low to see through; but with the laser, it's an extremely effective and highly controllable technique.

decidedly less ideal than using a common pistol—at least if you know how to shoot one.

Should you get a Ruger PC Charger or similar handgun? Hell, yes! I had a lot of fun shooting this gun using all the techniques, and my 12-year-old daughter enjoyed shooting it too. It also has some practical application for

personal protection: At 25 yards, I was able to make head shots nine times out of 10 while shouldering the weapon. With a handgun, my successful head shot percentage was only 60 percent at that distance.

However, and undeniably, if you *really* want to have fun with this style of weapon system, and if you *really* want to get good

hits fast and make it the most suitable for home defense, get a laser. Or, better yet, get a light-and-laser combo similar to the Surefire X400.

You should also get one of those confusing, ATF-addressed arm braces. The folding versions are the best, and the Sig Sauer unit I tested was lightweight and very well-made. **GDTM** 

## The precision shooter's tools have kept pace to accomplish the mission at hand.

he sniper rifle, engineered expressly for long-range shooting, singularly captures the American imagination.

It's little wonder why.

Aside from their incredible ballistic feats, the men who wielded these specialized tools exemplified the best traits of our soldiers. Be it the U.S.

in the hands of patriot militia or light infantry units.

Despite extending a soldier's effective range past 200 yards—accurately, mind you—it has a couple of gaping holes that stymied wider adoption. Compared to muskets, the .40- to .50-caliber rifles were more difficult and time-consuming to load. The

behind the primer) legendary U.S. Volunteer Sharpshooting Regiments and their Sharps Rifle.

Breechloading, set trigger, capable of delivering its deadly payload past 1,000 yards, the .52-caliber was among the most accurate rifles of its time—a terrifying instrument when you think about it. Remember, many battles

That last point is especially true. Whereas infantry takes hundreds of thousands of rounds to record a kill, the sniper's requirements have remained consistently low: an efficient 1.3 rounds at last count. That's a testament to their training and tools. Neither one is a recent occurrence.

### THE DEERSLAYER GOES TO WAR

Perhaps no single muzzleloader stirs the American imagination more than the American Long Rifle. Just the mention of what's better known now as the "Kentucky Rifle" conjures up images of Colonists picking off Red Coats at distance.

The accurate flintlock did play that role in America's struggle for independence, perhaps most notably in the battles of Kings Mountain and Saratoga. The war even saw the first formalization of an American sniper unit (of sorts) by Daniel Morgan, aptly called "Morgan's Riflemen." But overall, its part was small compared to that of the musket. Typically, it was found

grooves could foul after several shots and would require cleaning to regain accuracy. In addition, they were incompatible with bayonets, forcing a rifleman to turn to his knife or tomahawk—undesirably so—upon an infantry charge. Nevertheless, the American Long Rifle did enough damage during the American Revolution to earn a place in the nation's heart and mythology.

## SURGICAL PRECISION IN A CLUB FIGHT

Brutal. Few words better sum up the American Civil War. The advent of the conical Minié Ball in 1849 made the Springfield Model 1851, Pattern 1853 Enfield and other rifled muskets much more accurate. However, rank-and-file fighting was the order of the day, giving both the Blue and the Gray soldiers barn door-sized targets at which to pitch the devastatingly effective soft-lead projectiles.

Despite the close and grizzly battles, sniper tactics were coming into their own. Both the Union and Confederate soldiers had sharpshooting regiments. Perhaps the most famed was Brigadier General Hiram Berdan's (the name

were won by those best with the bayonet. A rifle that could knock you out of your brogans, sight unseen, is enough to send chills from leggings to kepi.

Berdan's men used it to good effect, most notably at Gettysburg. Some even got outfitted with the breakthrough technology of the day—a telescopic sight. And, while its reputation precedes it, the Sharps might not have been the most feared sniper rifle in the War Between the States. That distinction goes to the Whitworth Rifle.

The unusual hexagonal bullets the hexagonally bored rifle shot were known to whistle in flight—a banshee's shrill that often meant death. However, Union soldiers had good reason to fear the abstruse rifle for more than just the sound it produced: It was *capable*. One proficient Confederate sent a bullet screaming from his Whitworth in December 1864 at Fort Sumpter to record what was then the longest kill by an American soldier—1,390 yards. Amazingly, the mark stood until World War I and remains in the top 20 of the most lengthy sniper kills of all time.

Even so, the .451-caliber rifle wasn't a miracle weapon. There weren't enough to make an impact, and the ones on hand were painfully slow, shot to shot—a curse of most accurate muzzle-loaders. Not that either made a difference



to a soldier who had a Whitworth bullet whistling toward him.

## INTERNATIONAL CONFLICT AND SNIPER ADVANCEMENT

What we would recognize as a sniper rifle was forged in the crucible of two world wars. Yes, today's highly engineered metal and synthetic rifles are lighter and more specialized than the Springfield M1903. But, like that old warhorse, modern sniper rifles pretty much remain bolt-actions, firing metallic cartridges, loaded with spitzer bullets and, most importantly, topped off with scopes.

The Springfield's role as the long-range backbone through both wars was default. Similar to most nations after World War I, the United States dismantled its sniper program and did not advance its weaponry by entering its sequel. Consequently, the evolution of the sniper system over this period is mainly defined by optics.

The .30-06 wore two primary scopes in World War I: the Warner & Swasey

1908 (or 1913 Telescopic Musket Sight) and the Winchester A5 Scope. The 5x A5 was the more desirable of the two. But, as is often the case in war, the lesser option was the more prevalent.

Warner & Swasey's Musket Sight was the official U.S. Army scope. By all accounts, it was a dog. In addition to weighing upward of 2 pounds, the prismatic scope was offset from the barrel. Nevertheless, both the '08 and '13 models could take a licking.

Neither was especially powerful. The 1908 was a more respectable 6x scope but was reduced to 5.2x by 1913 to open the field of view. In either case, the magnification was more than enough for trench warfare. "No man's land"—the space between opposing trenches—rarely exceeded 300 yards.

The opposite of the Warner & Swasey, Winchester's scope was top of the line. Mercifully, it also followed the fundamentals of scope operation; chief among these was that it was centrally mounted and turret-adjusted ... only, the damned thing was like fighting with a Fabergé egg!

The rifle's recoil, alone, was enough





to decimate it, leading to free-float mounting. This meant the eye relief had to be reset after every shot. Still, it was an upgrade for doughboys lucky enough to be issued one.

World War II's mass production saw the advent of America's first assembly line sniper rifle—the M1903A4. Not much differentiated it from other Springfields, except that the iron sights were left off to make room for the scope—in this case, the Weaver 340C 01. The American Long Rifle still stirs the American imagination. Deadly past 200 yards, the rifle played only a limited role in the Revolutionary War, given how long it took to load and its incompatibility with a bayonet. (Photo: Rock Island Auction Company)

generally had better luck, although they arguably had a system more suited to their application. The rifles were older (the vintage World War I M1903A1), but the scopes were much more appropriate (the Unertl 8x).

What became known as the M1941 Marine Corps Pattern Rifle was a sniper's sniper system. As they do today, Marines had to know their DOPE and dial in each shot. However, the Unertl made it easy. The scope had oversized turrets, with both tactile and audible clicks. You could get on target, even in the thick of battle. So, what if the freefloat mounts meant you had to reset

hampered and overshadowed.

The rifle perhaps didn't live up to its full potential, typically used 600 yards in, due to the lack of match-grade ammunition. Most simply pitched the somewhatless-accurate Army-issued M2 ball.

Then, there was the style of battle waged on the Asian peninsula: A big war in a little country, the slaughter was primarily wrought from machine guns, wave frontal assaults and artillery barrages. Despite this, skunkworking snipers came up with some clever systematic advances in Korea.

None was more notorious than Army Major William Brophy's .50-caliber monstrosity. Essentially, it was a Russian anti-tank rifle with an M2 machine gun barrel slapped on it. Of course, a bipod was necessary—and,

The glass was good and durable, but it wasn't powered to pick fleas off a dog's back. At 2.5x magnification, it was, at best, more of a midrange option. This, combined with the United States having to reboot its sniper program, is perhaps the reason the Yanks struggled early on with their much-moreexperienced German counterparts.

The same can't quite be said for those in the Pacific Theater. Marine snipers

the eye relief after every trigger pull? You had the confidence you'd hit what you aimed at. In the hands of skilled snipers, that was enough.

Semi-automatic snipers rifles—at least in concept—also came about in World War II. However, it would have to wait until Korea to get put to the test.

## **CROSSHAIRS ON EAST ASIA**

The contributions of the M1C in the Korean War weren't child's play. The semi-auto M1 Garand, modified to accept the M73 scope made by Lyman, was impressive ... although it was

for safe measure, a butt pad. For the finishing touch, Brophy crowned it with a 20x Unertl. Real "Frankenstein's lab" stuff—but effective.

Brophy and others were able to make communists "good communists" from 2,000 yards out. More importantly, the first .50-caliber sniper rifle inspired an entirely new concept of what discipline might be.

However, we'll get to that shortly. We still have one more stop in Asia—a tough slog during which the sniper truly came into his own: Vietnam.

Tactically, his role made sense. Small-unit actions lent themselves to a war defined by thick jungles, where finding an enemy to engage was half the battle. It was a hunt and required

hunters—such as Carlos Hathcock. An accomplished competitive shooter for the Marine Corps, and winning the 1965 Wimbledon Cup at Camp Perry, his marksmanship was unimpeachable. So was his fieldcraft. There's much written about Hathcock and the patience he showed in the face of hell for a single trigger pull.

For the most part, that squeeze for Hathcock and other scout snipers came from behind a heavy-barreled Winchester Model 70. Typically, these were reconditioned Marine Corps match rifles ... which might seem a small factor. It isn't. Why? Simple: The good, old 70 wasn't a service rifle; it wasn't even close.

If anything, this showed that the U.S. military was beginning to recognize the particular role the sniper played on the battlefield. He was a specialized warrior who needed a specialized tool. He got it with the protean Remington 700.

### **COMING OF AGE**

Up to this point, a lot of the sniper rifle discussion has revolved around optics. Make no mistake: In talking M40, M24 and other 700 military variants, this is still an important factor. But it's not the only one.

From buttstock to muzzle crown, these rifles were specifically tuned for their job. Barrel, trigger, ammunition—nothing was left to chance. Even so, the most obvious development was the stock. Soon after the M40, it was no longer a one-size-fits-all hunk of walnut.

For example, take the Army's most recent 700 variation, the M2010 Enhanced Sniper Rifle. Little surprise—it wears a chassis. Complete with thumbwheel length of pull and comb rise adjustments, snipers get the same consistent fit that match shooters seek. They

should; their target is more vital than a bull's-eye.

However, the M2010 wasn't the first to latch onto these concepts. As early as the 1970s, Marine armorers upgraded the M40 with a fiberglass McMillan A1 stock, along with other modifications, creating the M40A1. The stock wasn't adjustable, but it took inaccuracies due to stock swell all but out of the equation.

And, along with configuration, optics and caliber have also improved the modern sniper system. The M2010 is topped with a Leupold Mark 4 6.5–20x50mm ER/T M5A2 Front Focal variable power for most daylight operations. Aside from more and variable power, the scope uses a Horus H58 grid reticle, giving snipers the ability to hold over, lead shots and deal as never before.

As far as caliber is concerned, the trend has been larger and magnum. True enough, the 7.62 has been the mainstay since right after mid-century. But the .300 Win. Mag. (for which the M2010 is chambered) and .338 Lapua Magnum have become more accepted, just as snipers have become expected to hit longer and harder. Still, even those cartridges are small fries compared to what else presently resides in the sniper's toolbox.

### **NOT JUST OVERWATCH**

Radar arrays are expensive, vital and difficult to replace. It takes serious man-hours to fix a jet engine or delicate communications equipment. It would certainly be a shame if someone went ahead and poked a hole in one. Grasp this, and you grasp the concept of hard target interdiction: Sow chaos through material deprivation. Not that you couldn't with the tried-and-true







7.62, but something with a little more "oomph" would get the job done with a little more gusto ... say, a .50-caliber. Brophy and Hathcock both proved that the .50 BMG is an adequate long-range precision cartridge. Nevertheless, for all but a masochist, their versions aren't really small-unit mobile.

Enter the Barrett M82. A beast among precision rifles, this semi-automatic .50-caliber has an effective range of 1,900 yards. If manning a shoulder-fired .50 sounds about as coveted a position as a crash-test dummy, it should be. Yet, with the Barrett, it isn't. In part, this is thanks to its weight—a whopping 27 pounds—and a recoil-absorbing barrel assembly. Topped with a 4.5–14x50 Leupold Mark 4, the M82 has dealt its fair share of far-out damage.



In 2004, Sergeant Brian Kremer of the U.S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Ranger Battalion let loose with his Barrett on an Iraqi insurgent and connected from 2,515 yards out. To save pen and paper calculations, this longest U.S. sniper kill to date came in at just shy of a mile and a half. It's a testament to where sniping stands today.

## **FUTURE SHARP SHOTS**

Given that the sniper effective range resides somewhere around mind-boggling, it's difficult to ponder where it might be in 10, 20 or 50 years from now. It's certain that equipment—rifle, scope, ammunition—will only continue to improve and, with that, the sniper's deadly range and role.

But no matter: If it's a Springfield or some yet-imagined shoulder cannon, his aim will remain constant: One shot, one kill. **GDTM**

followers and barrels, as well as a proprietary scope mounting system. The rifle is fast—once you get used to the straight-pull bolt—and is well-suited for both precision shooting and fast follow-up shots.

The action locks up using a set of radial lugs, and while it's a radical departure from the traditional dual locking lugs of the Mauser 98, Winchester 70 or Remington 700, it's strong and reliable. The modular design of the action

might take some getting used to, but with a few tries, you'll be assembling/ disassembling the action quickly. In fact, removing and installing any part of the system is relatively "mindless," and the only tool required is the Allen key that locks down the barrel.

It all goes together in a relatively



simple manner, with the parts either sliding or snapping into the receiver, which, itself, is permanently mounted in the stock. The barrel is screwed to the forend with two Allen-head bolts; the manual indicates that "finger-tight" is sufficient. The magazine is snapped into the trigger assembly, which is then snapped into the bottom of the

cocking/de-cocking lever.

You're now ready to shoot.

Switching bolt heads is just as easy. There's a retainer latch underneath the bolt assembly. Using a fingernail, small screwdriver or the tip of a pocketknife, move the latch to the left and outward (while keeping the slightest amount of rearward pressure on the bolt). Twist

the shoulder while reloading. While most of the R8 rifles have a more traditional, pistol-grip-style stock, the R8 Ultimate uses a thumbhole-style design with a palm swell grip and a nicely textured grip.

The comb and buttstock are both adjustable, providing all sorts of flexibility to the unit. A spring-loaded

button on the left side of the stock allows the shooter to raise and lower the comb height, and a lever on the lower left side of the butt releases the recoil pad to customize the length of pull. In the middle of the recoil pad on the left side is another spring-loaded button to raise the recoil pad up and down. In short, a perfect fit is easily attainable in a matter of seconds.

The proprietary scope mount uses four recesses on the barrel and a rail attachment to quickly and easily attach the optic to the rifle. The test rifle came with a Blaser Infinity 2.8-20x50 scope that featured a fine duplex reticle and an illuminated center dot. While rather heavy—the Infinity weighs in at 27 ounces—it was crystal clear and took adjustments just fine.

## THE CARTRIDGE TRIO

With all this in mind, I thought of the best choices in cartridges to maximize the effectiveness of this rifle ... without overdoing things. While I was staring off

into space at the Blaser booth, I was informed of the new .22 LR conversion kit.

"I'm sorry; the what?!?"

"Yes, Phil," the Blaser folks confirmed. "We're now offering a conversion kit for the R8 to allow the same stock, receiver and trigger system to be used for a .22 LR."

This system is *slick*.

So, in the name of universal availability, I chose the trio of .22 LR, .30-06 Springfield and the .375 Holland & Holland Magnum. I can't think of too many scenarios that couldn't be effectively handled by that trio. Yes, a serious prairie dog hunter might opt for a speedier small-bore, but these three cartridges are among the most popular ever developed and work wonderfully.

### **RANGE TIME**

I packed up a big box of ammo (because I had three cartridges to test) and my range bag to head over to the proving grounds (better known as "Dad's Backyard").

Ol' Grumpy Pants' initial reaction to the Blaser R8 was what you might have come to expect: "What the hell is that thing?"

After going through the barrel/bolt head/magazine changing routine, he started that raised-eyebrow-cocked-head look he gives when he's thinking about giving his approval. And, once I had 15 rounds downrange, he was on board with the whole idea.

I started with the .30-06 barrel and took a few shots to get the gun zeroed. Because both barrels were sporter barrels, I decided on three-shot groups for accuracy testing. I had a couple of Federal loads, a pair for Sig Sauer and a Nosler factory load that I'm particularly fond of.

It was apparent from the first group that this gun was a shooter. I like bullets between 165 and 180 grains for an all-around load for the .30-06. The worst group—coming in at an average of 1.1 MOA—was Federal's new 175-grain Terminal Ascent load. The best load was Federal's 165-grain Fusion load, which put three shots into just over ½ MOA.

The Sig Sauer Elite Hunter Tipped 165-grain load and 175-grain Elite Performance load each averaged

right around ¾ MOA, and the Nosler 180-grain Ballistic Tip load printed just a bit bigger. The 22-inch barrel gave

velocities just a bit below the advertised values on the boxes, but nothing to the point of concern.

Next up was the .375 H&H barrel, with which I decided to test Federal's

Cape-Shok 300-grain Trophy Bonded Bear Claw softpoint and the Norma 300-grain Oryx load. This was an eye-opener: I know the .375 can be an accurate cartridge, but the group size rivaled that of the .30-06 barrel. The Federal load printed three shots at exactly 1 inch, and the Norma load measured .65 inch, with the best load at ½ inch. The 24-inch barrel showed 2,520 fps for the Norma load and 2,415 fps (advertised 2,400 fps) for the Federal load.

Using the same scope for the two calibers, I had to make an 8-inch elevation adjustment and about 2 inches of windage. All things considered, it was pretty consistent.

I next converted the rifle to handle the .22 LR—just about as radical a departure from the .375 H&H as you could ask for—and moved from the 100yard target board to the 50-yard board. Federal's Gold Medal 40-grain bullets put five shots in a dime, and Remington's Thunderbolts put five in a nickel.

This rifle is the bane of limb rats everywhere. When using the .22 LR conversion, the bolt throw is shortened up to about half the distance of the .375 throw. While I had no issues whatsoever with feeding or extraction, I will say that loading the .22 LR magazine was a bit of a chore, because the cartridges tended to roll to one side or the other of center instead of in the loading groove. I found it easier to remove the trigger assembly, load the magazine and replace the assembly.

## **PROS AND CONS**

Is the Blaser R8 Ultimate the ultimate rifle? It's a matter of taste. The Blaser is a great system, especially for the traveling hunter. It can be broken down and housed in a compact case and is wonderfully repeatable. And I suppose the price (\$5,428) will play a major role in your decision-making process. Does the Blaser, with two or three barrels, satisfy your needs as a hunter?

If you intend to hunt a wide variety of game animals, which will require a number of different calibers, the Blaser R8 will certainly fit the bill and provide you with a wonderful level of consistency. The trigger pull will be the same for all your chosen cartridges: My Lyman digital trigger scale

indicated the test rifle's trigger broke at just under 2 pounds. And, with the fast flexibility of the Ultimate's stock, you can modify the rifle for the amount of clothing you'll be wearing. The bolt location, safety, stock feel, balance, trigger pull and other features will all be the same every time you go hunting. There's definitely something to be said for that.

If you enjoy the driven hunt—during which multiple running targets are a strong possibility, if not a certainty—the speed of the R8 is an assured benefit. This rifle can send the lead downrange faster than any turnbolt and second only to an auto-loader. It's more than accurate enough for precision shooting at nearly any distance and is both ergonomic and portable.

All that said, you probably know I'm a bit of a traditionalist when it comes to rifles. I love the old cartridges, their history, and the rifles and actions in the style of the late-19<sup>th</sup> and early-20<sup>th</sup> centuries. A worn walnut stock, replete with the scars of many hunting adventures, grabs my attention. I enjoy a stock with a good figure and flat top checkering, as well as the simple warmth of walnut. I enjoy the craftsmanship and hand touches of a Gewehr 98 Mauser or pre-1964 Winchester Model 70.

Does the R8 Ultimate have those characteristics? Well, no, but that might be a good thing in your book. The Blaser R8 is its own animal and doesn't try to be something it's not. Being completely honest, I prefer a Mauser-style action or double rifle for dangerous-game work. That said, I know a good number of professional hunters who rely on the R8 for guide work among Africa's most dangerous animals.

If I had to find one major issue with the rifle system, it would be in the safety/cocking system. It's undeniably safe, but I've seen hunters have issues pushing the lever into the "fire" position. It takes considerable effort and, with cold hands, it can be a struggle.

Blaser's R8 Ultimate could end up being a "new classic." Col. Townsend

The R8 is *most definitely* an "interesting" rifle. For those who are forming their own opinions about what a rifle is


or isn't, the R8 has the potential of being one of the quintessential designs.

hen I was learning guns and gunsmithing, Smith & Wesson was *the* handgun provider to law enforcement. Oh, it offered long guns from time to time, but not ones it actually made. The 21st century has brought us a lot of changes. S&W now makes revolvers, pistols and rifles. No shotguns, but this company would be crazy to try that ... and S&W is *not* crazy.

Also, the .300 Blackout and its predecessor, the .300 Whisper, were once thought of as solely super-quiet, used-with-suppressors thumpers. Hurling 200-plus-grain bullets just under the speed of sound, they were essentially .45 ACP+P carbines that could be made the epitome of quiet.

Well, that also changed.

You see, the .300 BLK has just the right-sized case to get a 110- to 125-grain hunting-type bullet up to useful velocities. In fact, if you're willing to go with a carbine or longer barrel, you can get those bullets up to pretty much equal the .30-30.

And S&W has the carbine for it, if not the rifle. Carbines are handier for hunting anyway. S&W starts with its excellent M&P receiver set—a pair of forgings that are machined to mil-spec dimensions. The flat-top receiver is ready for whatever optic or irons you select.

I see this as a good thing, because we all have different ideas as to what comprises the perfect setup for our own hunting situations. When gunsmithing, I had no end of customers who wanted a 3-9X scope on their .30-06 rifle for deer hunting. But where I hunted (and most of the state was the same, truth be told), 100 yards was a long shot, and 9X was more than I needed or wanted. So, "long" shots are most often at 100 yards, max, for most shooters and in most thick-cover situations.

However, S&W gives you the option of having more, if you want it. So, put the scope you want on top, using the rings you want, because S&W made that easy.

Inside, the bolt and carrier are mil-spec and are given a matte-black finish. They mate up with a medium-profile barrel that's made of 4140 steel, and the barrel is given an Armornite finish. This is a surface-hardening and corrosion-resistance treatment that

we're now familiar with; it's known as a "nitrocarburizing process." The barrel has a twist of one turn in 7.5 inches—plenty fast enough to stabilize those heavyweights (should you wish to spend an afternoon of giggleworthy plinking) while hurling 220-to 240-grain bullets downrange at leisurely velocities.

### **GAS BLOCK DETAILS**

The gas block isn't a standard A1 triangle; rather, it's a low-profile gas block with a section of Picatinny rail machined on top. This means that if you want iron sights on your S&W M&P15, you can do it. Just be sure to order a front sight that's labeled as "gas block rail" height, not handguard height.

The gas block is also the part that holds the front handguard retaining ring in place. The M&P has standard carbine handguards—not a tacti-cool, free-float handguard. Some might see this as a step back. I don't.

Free-float handguards are both an individual preference (in that regard, not unlike sights/optics) and more expensive than standard handguards. And, as with the optics, if you have a preference, and it matters that much to you, it's easy enough to rebuild any AR-15 rifle or carbine.



go, this one's pretty darned good.

If you're still worried that the trigger isn't "good enough," fear not. I have, on regular occasions, dropped the small, computer-controlled popup targets on a National Guard range—the 300-meter ones—with a rack-grade trigger on an M4 and iron sights. If you have magnifying optics or a red-dot sight and a deer at 100

which the AR-15, as the modern sporting rifle, has it all over the traditional rifles and carbines.

The stock and the gas block each have a sling swivel, so you can easily install a sling for the hike to your blind. In addition and not that you need it for most uses the barrel is threaded at the muzzle, and S&W has installed a flash hider. I don't

know of any load for the .300 Blackout that produces enough muzzle blast to need a flash hider, but the company put one there because, well, some of you are going to install a suppressor, and for that, you need threads.

### **BLACKOUT-SPECIFIC BULLETS**

As previously mentioned, the .300 Blackout was developed to be a heavy-thumper subsonic cartridge. Never-

And don't use a .300 cartridge loaded with a too-short bullet.

### **TEST RESULTS**

Testing was easy. I simply swept a suitable array of hunting loads off the shelf, carted the M&P to the range (along with a suitable scope) and had fun.

The scope I selected is a new one to me. It's Primary Arms' 1-6X24 ACSS-Raptor, which features a 30mm tube and


theless, to use it for hunting calls for a lighter bullet, and that's where the 110-to 125-grain bullets come in—unlike bullets designed for other cartridges (the .30 Carbine and the 7.62 AK come to mind), for which a stubby projectile is needed or demanded.

Just to fit the action, the Blackout has different needs. In order to feed properly, bullets have to be longer than the Carbine or AK bullets would be, and this means a bullet meant for the AK round won't be suitable for loading in the Blackout. As a result, the cartridge-and bullet-makers came up with Blackout-specific projectiles.

Another reason for the longer bullets, besides reliable feeding, is safety. It's possible to mix up a .300 Blackout cartridge with .223/5.56 ammunition and not notice it while loading it into a magazine. A properly longer bullet in the .300 will wedge into the .223 chamber neck and prevent the bolt from closing (this situation is called a "clue"!). If that happens, you simply work the bolt to extract the improper cartridge, check the rest and continue.

A too-short bullet, in this instance, might allow the bolt to close. But, when you pull the trigger, bad things happen. Very bad things. So, don't mix ammo; and, if the bolt won't close, find out why.











optic, which means that the reticle apparently increases in size as you zoom up to 6X. For fast engagements, it has a reticle with a horseshoe loop, along with a chevron in the center with holdover bars for bullet drop compensation. Primary Arms is asking \$400 for this scope—a smoking-good deal! It might sound like overkill, but I chose a Geissele Super Precision mount.

Considering the trajectory and range of the .300 Blackout, you simply (once zeroed) nestle the horseshoe behind the shoulder of the whitetail in question and cleanly press the trigger. As far as trajectory goes, if you sight-in dead on at 100 yards, your drop at 200 is going to be 5 inches. If you sight-in 1 inch high at

Those with sharp eyes can opt for a red-dot sight and use the 1X with the variable-power dot to aim with. Just for plinking fun, I parked an Aimpoint Micro m2 on top and had a merry time clanging the steel plates on my club's 100-yard range.

### SIMPLY STELLAR

Accuracy from the M&P15 and the various .300 loads was everything you'd need, and expect, for a hunting rifle. A lightweight carbine, and one with soft recoil, the S&W M&P15 is a stellar tool.

OK, here's a comparison—the classic Winchester M94 carbine in .30-30. Here, we have an iron-sighted carbine with no provision to mount a scope. At

weighing between 125 and 170 grains. The current standard is 150 grains. The "book" velocity on a 125-grain bullet is approximately 2,500 fps, but you can chronograph a lot of .30-30 ammunition and never see that. Mostly, your 125-grain bullet will be doing (big surprise) 2,400 fps or slightly fewer. Oh, and your .30-30 is always going to be a five-shot lever gun. But, the M&P15 can easily be fed from a five-shot magazine or can use 30-rounders for plinking.

The M&P15 in .300 Blackout gets a 125-grain bullet up to more than 2,300 fps. Sure, that isn't the more-than-2,400 fps the .30-30 can allegedly do, but with the M&P15, you get a self-loading rifle of the same weight with easy optics mounting options and velocity that's






more than close enough. And really, I'm not sure the difference matters to any whitetail out there.

The bonus Mossy Oak camo pattern is something that comes with the M&P and saves you the work of trying to camo-paint your own flat-black MSR.

If you have a .30-30 and want to hunt with the same rifle your father, grandfather and perhaps even your greatgrandfather used, don't let me stop you. However, the S&W M&P15 Mossy Oak camo in .300 Blackout could be the start of a new tradition. **GDTM** 



## Accuracy, reliability and today's AR platform.



All the same chambering, all different. The three Brownells builds here offer something for everyone and are all very practically accurate.



Three different Brownells bolt carrier groups, each with a different finish. The phosphate is the oldest style and is commonly found on military copies. This is a very durable finish—but it's the hardest to clean. The nitride finish is a bit slicker but is not as easy to clean as the nickel-boron coating. The ability to wipe the complex parts clean with a rag is a huge plus.



t's not a stretch to say that the AR-15 is the most popular centerfire rifle in America right now. However, this popularity has come with a variety of misconceptions and falsehoods. One of the things most commonly misunderstood—and often overhyped—is the accuracy potential inherent to the design.

## AR ACCURACY: A RECENT DEVELOPMENT

Today's AR wears many hats—from target shooter to home defender. The view of the rifle changed dramatically after the sunset of the assault weapons ban (AWB) in the early 2000s. Until then, the market surrounding the rifle was heavily based on military and law enforcement products, and there wasn't much of an understanding of the qualities of the rifle as a result. It was just one design among many, and it wasn't considered as being close to the best at any given task.

Most of the purpose-built rifles made for accuracy came designed for position-based competition. The vast majority of these types of rifles had features reminiscent of the classic Colt HBAR (heavy-barrel automatic rifle), which was the first real attempt to make the AR valid on the competition line as a sporting rifle. This rifle is an example of where development would've likely stopped if the AWB had been renewed.

Had it not been for returning veterans in the early 2000s, the popularity of the rifle would have likely never taken off. It wasn't a popular gun after the Vietnam War, and there weren't many options outside of the factory guns. Hollywood didn't care for the black rifle and instead opted to arm heroes with classic Americana such as the Smith & Wesson Model 29 and the 1911. The M16 brought back too many bad memories.

## **4 MOA RIFLE**

It's no surprise that advancements in the platform didn't appear for decades. While there were some improvements, virtually all of them were requested and applied by the military. As a generation of young Americans returned home from Iraq and Afghanistan, one of the first things discovered was the significant improvements that could be made to the M4 or M16. The general accuracy standard for the M4 and M16 is 4 MOA, and any lower-end commercial rifles built to that same military spec are within the same accuracy range.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Black Hills Ammunition's 77-grain OTM is a proofpositive accuracy cartridge with roots in the military as the legendary MK262 Mod1. This ammunition is so good and so consistent from the factory that it can be used as a diagnostic load to true-out a finicky AR.

If you're trying to see what's wrong with your build or factory gun, this ammo can quickly help you decipher what's happening in the cycling process and on paper, due to the fact that the runout is so low. I regularly set a baseline with this load and then begin testing others afterward. Note that it's not suitable for slow twist rates such as 1:12 inches.

It's not as precise in adjustment as a varmint scope, but once you settle on a good general zero, the rifle's good to any range at which you can practice—within reason.





So, how is it that the AR has earned a reputation for accuracy when the standards are apparently not that great? The answer comes from the large number of shooters who'd have otherwise been completely turned off of rifle shooting, had it not been for this particular

design. The AR is very ergonomic, lightweight and has low recoil, thanks to the 5.56mm cartridge. These things work together to provide a very pleasant shooting experience.

For many people up until now, an accurate rifle was a heavy, high-recoil

or specialty product that didn't appeal to the masses. What needs to be understood about the AR is that it's the most accurate rifle most people actually shoot at normal distances. You can certainly find precision bolt-actions that'll put every shot in the same hole all day long. But, for most people, they're not something that's a reality to master in terms of cost and technical skills. The AR is the first rifle that truly attracts the masses by its own merits.

### **UNDERSTANDING AR ACCURACY**

As a broad generalization, the AR is an easy rifle to make accurate. It's a difficult rifle to make *consistent*. The major problem with the platform is the number of moving parts and the way those moving parts interact with each other during the firing cycle. There are very few moving parts on a bolt-action that interfere with accuracy.

There are two major areas that cause an AR to suffer in the accuracy department, and they're both due to the element of consistency. The design comprises a split receiver. The upper and lower receivers are a "fault line" of sorts that can have a very detrimental relationship. Upper and lower fit are quite important, but there's no real way to solve it, aside from welding them together (*don't* do that!). The primary method of restricting play between the two halves is to install a small plug such as the AccuWedge.

This little rubber plug makes it so that there's pressure exerted between the upper and lower in such a way that it essentially creates a form of bedding. I commonly use these to prevent rattle between the receivers, but they do little to improve on-target accuracy in the real world.

The other major area is the upper receiver itself. The first among these is that the barrel is never truly free-floating. The gas tube makes it so that this isn't an option. Pinned gas blocks tend to hinder accuracy, while clamp-ons seem to be better, although marginally. The reason is that you can tighten a clamp-on with excellent consistency, although the same can't be said for a pinned block. Pinning the gas block can put stress on the barrel,

as well as induce uneven pressure.

There's also physical interaction between the bolt carrier group and the gas tube. There's a rattle on many uppers that can be heard when the bolt is retracted. This is the gas tube moving around a little bit in the hole that leads to the interior of the upper. If you have too much play here, the closed bolt can exert pressure on the gas tube, and thus, the barrel.

To make matters worse, the upper receiver's fit to the barrel extension must now be addressed. On many rifles, this fit is never addressed. And, most people never really consider it when building their own upper. Many of the old, 2000-era factory guns have a very tight fit in this department. Most barrels and uppers today simply slide together with some degree of wiggle. It would be fair

to say that many of today's builds rely on an over-tightened barrel nut to compensate for this lack of rigidity.

Over-tightening a barrel nut on your own build isn't a good thing. Most of them don't need to be exceptionally tight, although they certainly need to be tighter than via a simple hand-fitting. Putting too much compression force on the nut will (surprisingly) result in a loss of accuracy, because there's uneven pressure being exerted on the relatively delicate aluminum of the upper.

Next comes the bolt carrier group and its relationship to the question. This particular set of parts gets blamed for the vast majority of issues. Maintaining the bolt is of paramount importance; it's the only part of the entire design that's seriously prone to failure without warning. Many shooters don't adequately BARREL LENGTH IS

A common question around AR accuracy often involves barrel length, which doesn't have much of an impact on mechanical accuracy; its impact is on the initial velocity of the small, 5.56mm bullet. A tiny, 10.5-inch build can be just as mechanically accurate as a 24-inch varmint gun and print groups just as small.

It's generally not the barrel that causes problems in small guns. The shortened gas system is really what robs accuracy from short barrels, because the increased cycling pressure, heat and fouling all result in a rapid decline in consistency.

maintain or replace parts on their bolt carrier group. This can lead to the bolt unlocking inconsistently due to carbon buildup and poor lockup when the bolt comes back into battery. Ejection becomes erratic in an excessively dirty gun and is a telltale indicator that something's wrong.

A consistent AR rifle will eject consistently. Why is this important? Well, it means your gun is using the gas it operates with in a consistent way, leading to normalized bolt travel and thus, predictable ejection of fired cases. Cases eject erratically when the bolt is moving at uneven speeds—either too fast or too slow. The bolt's travel should be smooth, with no resistance or grit.

Nevertheless, this has little to do with the bolt. The interior of the upper needs to be polished, sometimes with a truing



tool and lapping compound.

## YOU'VE BEEN LIED TO ABOUT AR ACCURACY

Most rifles are not as accurate as depicted. The performance generated on a weighted bench rest on a nice day using less-thanscientific methods of group measurement is sometimes considered "normal." There are, of course, some fantastic shots among those who write about guns. But, all too often, the results of the trials aren't repeatable from author to author.

It might come as a surprise to you that many AR rifles are 3 MOA guns.

Getting an AR to fire under 1 MOA with consistency is rare and not typically the norm for the design under field conditions. It can be done, but to get it there with consistency requires time and patience, as well as the understanding that reliability and accuracy don't always go hand in hand—as well as the acknowledgement that an accurate AR is an ever-changing beast that can shoot ½ inch one day and 4 inches the next.

Why does it change so much? The main thing that gets in the way of AR consistency is that it has so many issues

with cleaning and general maintenance. A perfectly clean AR is not a consistent AR, but a *dirty* AR is riddled with problems as well. What you're looking for is the balance between fouling and cleanliness that gives the best middle ground for consistency.

## HOW CAN YOU IMPROVE YOUR AR'S ACCURACY?

Adjustable stocks, different handguards and so many more accessories are constantly being released. Surely, someone has the answer by now that makes everything perfectly accurate, right? Not quite. Virtually all accessories not directly related to the barrel and its attachment to the upper receiver are either cosmetic or ergonomic in nature.


A free-floated rifle with a screw-mounted gas block is the best for accuracy, because it can be made just that much more consistent than a non-floated barrel with a pinned block. We're trying to avoid parts swelling from heat buildup, because the more heat distortion you get, the more rapidly your consistency drops off. A heavy barrel can help mitigate this, but it adds a great deal of weight to a rifle that's designed to be on the lighter end of the spectrum.

The best thing you can do for your rifle is not necessarily a barrel upgrade but a handguard swap. This is usually seen as a cosmetic change. However, a top-shelf handguard lends tremendous rigidity to the barrel and receiver junction. I recommend going with Geissele Automatics Super Modular Rail. This small change, along with a trigger from the same company, is all it takes to cut group size in half for many shooters. Geissele's handguards offer tremendous advantages and are rigid enough to withstand torque with a sling during rigorous matches. They're so strong that they're considered the standard for National Match competition.

## **MANAGE YOUR EXPECTATIONS**

The rifles highlighted in the accompanying images are designed to illustrate the variety you can get and still be consistent in field-type shooting. If you want something similar, all the parts of all these builds are available from Brownells.

The M16A1 build is quite accurate when it's cool, but accuracy drops a bit after a few mags. This rifle does 2 inches at 100 meters cold, but groups open up



A fully modern carbine is something of a do-all rifle. It must be accurate—but also light and capable. A rifle that does 2 inches with *any* ammo is a gem and will be good enough for most tasks without being overly complicated or hard to maintain.

to about 5 inches when it's hot.

The M27-style build is also a 2-inch gun at 100 meters, but it's more able to deal with the heat. It's a consistent 2-inch gun with all ammo, but it, too, heats up enough to have groups begin to open up to about 3 inches. It certainly handles heat better than the M16A1.

Lastly, the varmint/PRS setup is able to fire ¾ MOA groups. It's accurate enough for all general hunting use—but it's the most finicky regarding cleanliness and fouling. Clean it, and it'll shoot 2 inches, but after about 50 rounds, it settles in to ¾ inch. The problem is that you have to clean it quite a bit to make it run decently well.

If you're patient and have the time to practice, the AR can be a great rifle. For most people, the quest to make it into a tack-driver is a complete waste of time. The rifle's accuracy is plenty for most people who actually go out and shoot regularly. After all, there's nothing wrong with a 2-inch gun. GDTM

## HOW 'LONG' IS LONG RANGE FOR AN AR?

The typical AR carbine that shoots 3 MOA with decent ammo should be able to hit a man-sized target at about 300 yards from a 25-yard zero with most 55and 62-grain loads. Specially built long-range AR rifles can extend that distance to 600 to 800 yards ... with practice.

The real limiting factor is the 5.56mm cartridge; and the best 77-grain loads, such as the BHA Mk262, are quite capable at those ranges.

However, you need to pay attention to the wind, because even the best 5.56mm round is easy to blow off target with a slight gust.
